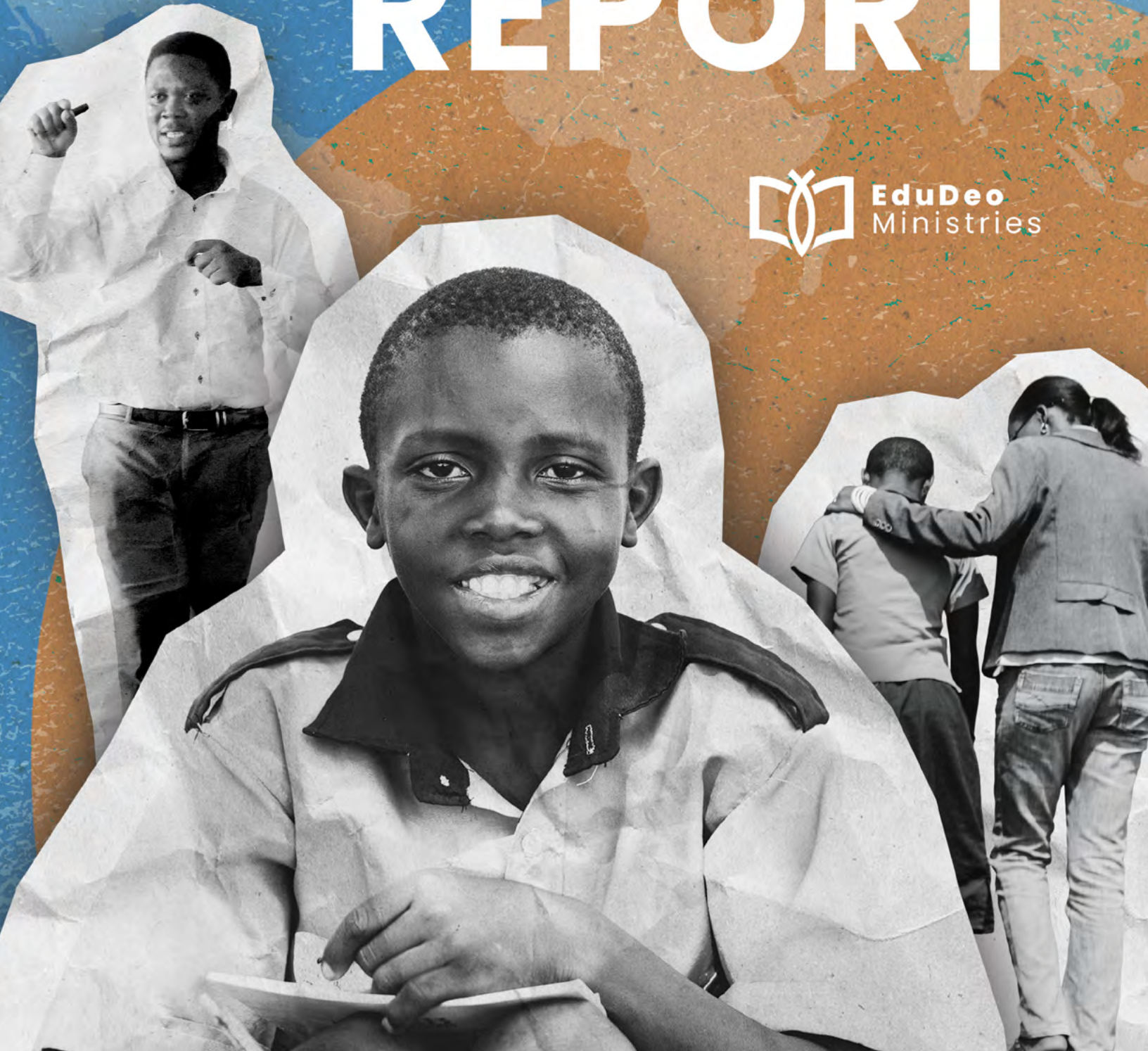


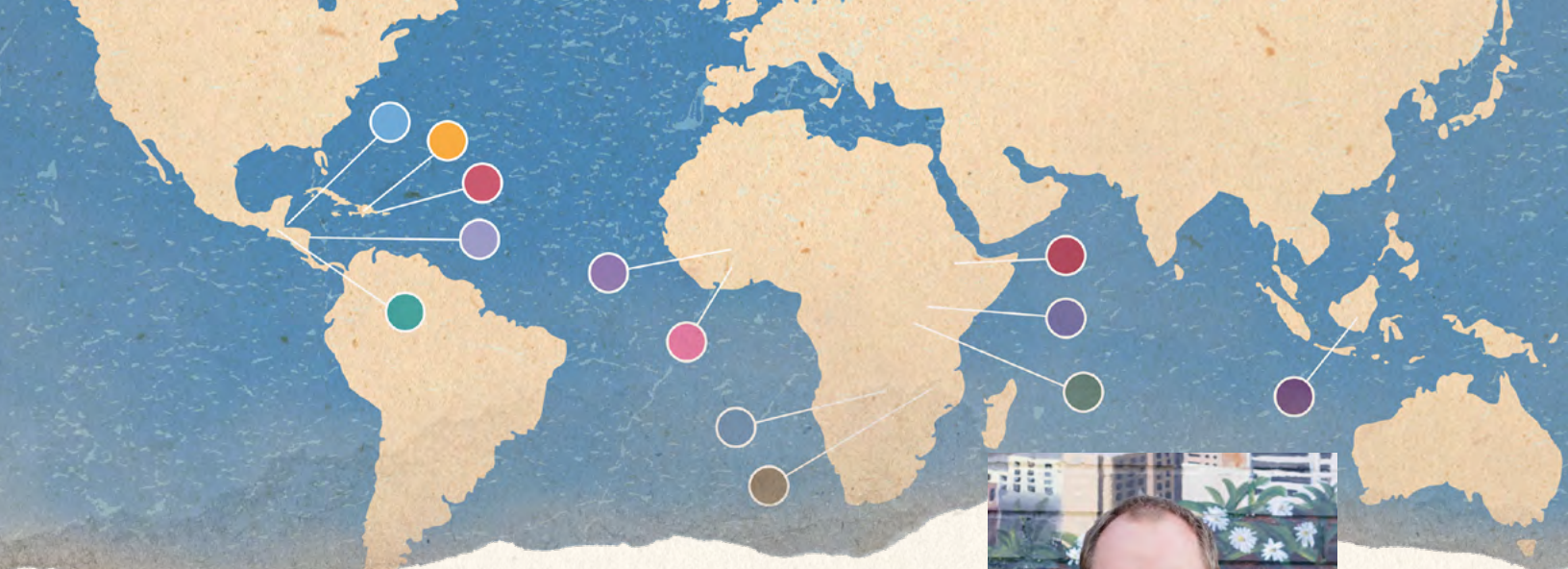

Your Generosity at Work



Construction Projects

Construction projects range widely based on the needs of a community. This year, in Belize a palaapa (playground shade structure) was constructed and new classrooms were built in the Dominican Republic, Ethiopia, and Zambia. Other projects include flooring, a computer lab, and a multi-purpose complex. Thirteen of those construction projects were completed by six Co-Impact church teams and seven Co-Impact school teams.



Road2Hope

Thanks to the fundraising of 184 R2H runners, supplies for vocational training in sewing and tailoring were purchased in Guatemala. This program helps girls exit poverty with meaningful work to support their families.



Warm Heart Project

Students across Canada helped bless Malawian children with disabilities by raising funds that helped build gardens at 5 schools. With these gardens, students learn better agricultural skills, benefit from a stable source of food and any surplus helps reduce the cost of tuition.



Golf Tournament

Our inaugural tournament raised \$45,000 to provide bursaries to children in need around the world. These funds knock down barriers so that more children have access to a quality education rooted in the Gospel.



PARTNER *Achievements*

Our partners each work within their own contexts to share and improve the quality of Christ-centred education they offer. Enjoy (and pray over) some highlights from the last fiscal year.

Belize

Having teachers who are equipped with a deep understanding of the foundations of Christ-centred education is critical to a quality education. This year all PCSB teachers were able to participate in EduDeo's Walking Together training.

Burkina Faso

AESEB was asked by the national church to represent and advocate for a Christ-centred education throughout the country to the federal government. This is all the more important in a nation that is predominantly Muslim.

Dominican Republic

Access to higher level teaching credentials helps to elevate the leadership of schools. Two Sinergia educators completed their master's degrees this past year, thanks to your ongoing support.



Ethiopia

An important way to deepen the relationship and impact of our partnerships is through partnership evaluations. This year, an evaluation was completed of EEUC and we celebrate the many incredible ways they are impacting their local communities.

Ghana

Teachers in INGH schools are creatively inspiring their students to view the world around them using a different lens. One such example resulted in students repurposing the materials around them to beautify their school playground in a resourceful and creative way.



Guatemala

Seeing a need within their community, AMG teachers started a sewing vocational program. This program was funded by many people who participated in and raised funds through Road2Hope 2024. AMG also hosted their own version of Road2Hope in their local community.

Haiti

In the midst of ongoing and difficult circumstances, CRECH launched a pedagogical psychology program. Educational leaders were trained to come alongside classroom teachers to better serve children with learning and behavioural difficulties resulting from trauma experienced within their community.

Indonesia

Reformasi schools are located on six different islands making trainings and workshops difficult to implement. With a Trainer of Trainers approach, key leaders are receiving foundational training and sharing that knowledge with the other schools within their region.

Malawi

This year CCAP Livingstonia celebrated its 150th anniversary. A core component to the denomination's ministry is its support for and leadership of 600+ schools. Collectively these schools represent 60% of all schools operating in the northern half of the country.

Nicaragua

Volunteer construction teams are an important way that partner schools are built. Working alongside local labour, the Nehemia Centre was able to host three Canadian Co-Impact teams that helped expand classrooms and opportunities for children in their communities.

Rwanda

In December 2024, CSR received formal approval from the federal government of their fledgling association of schools. This is an exciting milestone, giving greater voice to the Christian school movement in the country!

Uganda

PAG has a great structure in place that complements the work they are doing to train trainers. They completed their first Walking Together pathway, The Foundations of Christ-Centered Education, and look to build upon this foundation at further workshops.

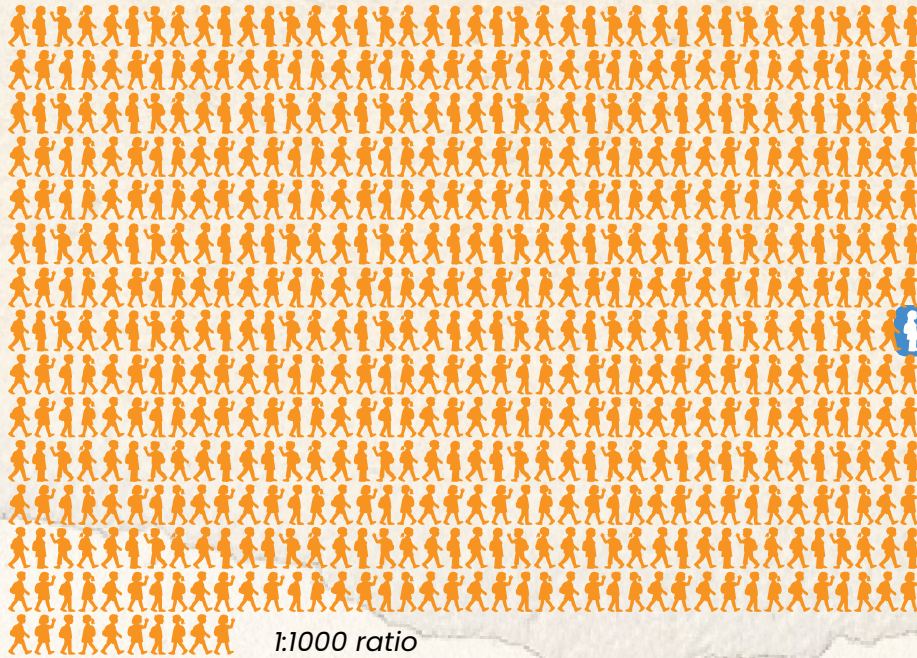
Zambia

The Proverbs School of Skills and Trades successfully opened its doors to its first cohort of students. This is the first time students have access to vocational training opportunities within their region, better preparing them for employment in their rural context.

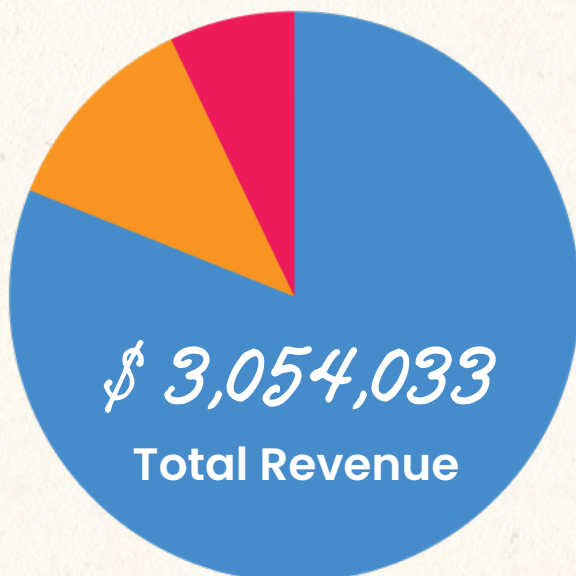

Seeds of Faith, *Fruits of Hope*

At EduDeo, we don't often get to see the **full story**. We plant seeds of Christ-centred education and trust that God will bring transformation in the lives of students, families, and communities. Yet, every once in a while, He allows us a glimpse, a reminder of what His faithful work looks like over time. Alejandro's story is one that allows us to look beyond the immediate and see the future impact.

When Alejandro was eleven, he arrived at an outreach supported by EduDeo's partner, Sinergia, in the Dominican Republic. He came from a home experiencing material poverty and had few opportunities. But within that Christ-centred space, he found safety, belonging, and something even greater: hope. **"Here,"** he says, **"we found a place to dream."**

Those dreams shaped his life. Inspired by visiting [Canadian Co-Impact] volunteers, Alejandro studied English, completed training in accounting, and today serves as a volunteer in the same space that once welcomed him as a child. Now, he helps other children discover their purpose and believe that, with God, their dreams are possible too.

"The reason we can dream," Alejandro says, **"is faith—faith in God who loves us and makes anything possible."**
